

Faculty of Medicine Academic Honesty Procedure

All coursework is submitted through Blackboard (http://learn.imperial.ac.uk/)

All submissions are ran through Turnitin and marked. Marker needs to take action if:

- 1) Turnitin Similarity Index > 25% OR
- 2) Suspicion of plagiarism

Action required if above occurs:

- Marker raises concerns with Course/Theme/other appropriate Academic Lead who must examine the allegation of plagiarism
- Course/Theme/other appropriate Academic Lead emails the student to:
 - o Notify them of the allegation
 - o Invite them to attend a formal meeting to discuss the allegation

At this meeting:

- The Academic Lead and one other academic staff member must complete, together with the student concerned, all areas of this form: https://education.med.imperial.ac.uk/Policies/allegationplagiarism.doc
- The Academic Lead then emails the completed form, together with the Turnitin Report of suspected coursework, to <u>acad.honesty.feo@imperial.ac.uk</u>

Academic Honesty Panel (AHP):

2. Rules if a plagiarism offence has been committed and if yes, whether it is Minor or Major.

Minor defines as: 1st offence, intentional or not plagiarism, incl. self-plagiarism, collusion (use of another student's work with consent), poor academic practice such as paraphrasing or poor referencing

AHP rules;

Penalty:

- **Major** defines as: 1) Anything not covered under Minor; 2) Prima facie plagiarism (intent to deceive) or poor academic practice (extensive paraphrasing and/or poor referencing); 3) Use of another student's work without their consent; 4) Suspected offences in more than one pieces of coursework simultaneously, even if each suspected offence can be defined as Minor in isolation; and 5) Where student does not admit plagiarism has occurred
- AHP forwards to Registry Registry Panel rules; Penalty:
- No case to answer and therefore no further action
- Informal reprimand (i.e. a note is kept on the student's departmental file)
- Informal reprimand and mark reduction for the assessment in question
- Informal reprimand and mark set to 'zero' for the assessment in question
