

## **Global Health Inequalities**

- 1 bn people worldwide survive on < 1\$ per day
  - 50% of the population of Sub-Saharan Africa
- Nearly 15% of the worlds population suffers from hunger,
  - 30% of the population under-nourished in SSA and 20% in South Asia
- 10% of children in SSA will die < 1 year of age
- A pregnant woman in SSA has nearly a 10% chance of dying in child birth in her lifetime

### **Millennium Development Goals**



The actions and targets contained in the **Millennium Declaration** at the UN Millennium Summit, Sept 2000 were:

- signed by 147 heads of state and governments
- adopted by 189 nations

The Declaration stipulates that the following should be achieved by 2015:

8 goals

21 targets

→
60 indicators

Ensure environmental sustainability




